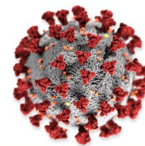


MEDIA = VIRUS

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Anti-vaxxer pundit Beverley Turner is 'blocked from ITV's This Morning' after on-screen row with presenter Dermot O'Leary over the coronavirus vaccine

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ITV has blocked pundit Beverley Turner from appearing on This Morning following an on-screen row over the coronavirus vaccine.

8 INFECTION FATALITY RATE

Infection fatality rate in different locations can be inferred from seroprevalence studies. While these studies have caveats,³¹ they show IFR ranging from 0.00% to 1.54% across 82 study estimates.⁴³ Median IFR across 51 locations is 0.23% for the overall population and 0.05% for people <70 years old. IFR is larger in locations with higher overall fatalities. Given that these 82 studies are predominantly from hard-hit epicentres, IFR on a global level may be modestly lower. Average values of 0.15%-0.20% for the whole global population and 0.03%-0.04% for people <70 years old as of October 2020 are plausible. These values agree also with the WHO estimate³² of 10% global infection rate (hence, IFR ~ 0.1%) as of early October 2020. Earlier higher quotes of average IFR that were irresponsibly circulated widely in media and social media were probably extremely flawed, as they depended on erroneous

How well do the COVID-19 vaccines work?

Anyone who gets COVID-19 can become seriously ill or have long-term effects (long COVID). The COVID-19 vaccines are the best way to protect yourself and others.

Research has shown the vaccines:

- significantly reduce your risk of getting seriously ill or dying from COVID-19
- reduce your risk of getting symptoms of COVID-19
- will help reduce your risk of catching and spreading COVID-19

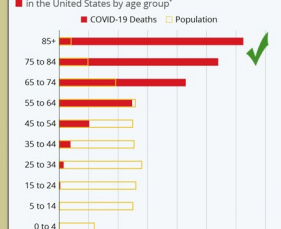
The 1st dose should give you good protection from 3 or 4 weeks after you've had it. You need 2 doses for stronger and longer-lasting protection.

There is a chance you might still get or spread COVID-19 even if you have a vaccine, so it's important to continue to follow all social distancing guidance.

The researchers say the differences were not explained by poverty but by historic racism and segregation.

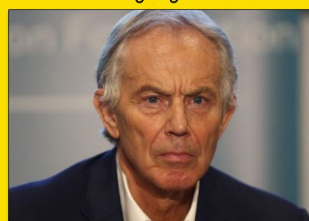
As a result, people of colour more generally, live in areas with fewer green spaces and more buildings and roads.
