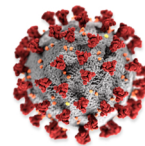

Covid-19 is killing more South Africans than cancer – and everything else: Discovery Life

In 2017, 7597 Discovery members were newly diagnosed with cancer, which equates to an incidence of 277 new cases per 100000 lives. The incidence is up from 251 in 2011, an increase of 10%.

In the report, Discovery says the increase in new diagnoses over the six years is largely due to an ageing membership. "The average age of members increased from 32.8 to 34.5 over the period, and the proportion of members aged 60 and older increased from 11% to 14%." **Discovery average membership age is increasing. 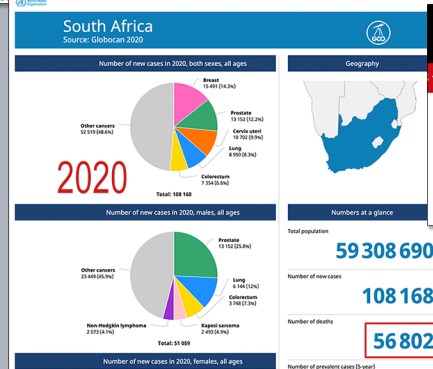
In the 2021 year, up to August, deaths attributed to Covid-19 stood at 57% of its total claims, said Discovery Life in an annual analysis of its data. That compares to an average, over nine years, of 27% of deaths from various heart and artery diseases.

Lung cancer, cervical cancer and oesophageal cancer are the three deadliest cancers in South Africa, accounting for 19 160 deaths in 2015, according to a new analysis of 32 cancer groups in 195 countries or territories. In 2015, there were 114 091 new cancer cases in South Africa and 58 237 deaths in total.

This article provides an update on the global cancer burden using the GLOBOCAN 2020 estimates of cancer incidence and mortality produced by the International Agency for Research on Cancer. Worldwide, an estimated 19.3 million new cancer cases (18.1 million excluding non-melanoma skin cancer) and almost 10.0 million cancer deaths (9.9 million excluding non-melanoma skin cancer) occurred in 2020. Female breast cancer has surpassed lung cancer as the most commonly

There were 9.6 million deaths from cancer worldwide in 2018.

In 2018, there were an estimated 9.6 million deaths from cancer (all cancers combined excluding non-melanoma skin cancer) worldwide: 5.4 million (56%) in males and 4.1 million (44%) in females, giving a male:female ratio of 10:7.7.[1]

The four most common cause of cancer death worldwide are lung, bowel (including anus), stomach and liver cancers, and account for more than four in ten (44%) of all deaths.[1]

Ohio college student 'angry' and 'scared' after 'cisgender men' installed radiator in dorms: 'Safe space'

A student at Oberlin College in Ohio described being "scared" and "angry" after the school announced a work crew would be installing radiators in a "safe space" dormitory for women and trans students, explaining the crew would likely be "cisgender men."

"I was angry, scared, and confused" Why didn't the College complete the installation over the summer, when the building was empty? Why couldn't they tell us precisely when the workers would be there? Why were they only notifying us the day before the installation was due to begin? Oberlin student Peter Fray-Witser wrote in an op-ed published in the college newspaper on Friday.

Noting that "Baldwin Cottage is the home of the Women and Trans Collective," and Baldwin's website describes the dorm as "a close-knit community that provides women and transgendered persons with a safe space for discussion, communal living, and personal development," Fray-Witser continued,

"Cisgender men are not allowed to live on the second and third floors, and many residents choose not to invite cisgender men to that space."
